THE BOOK OF GALATIANS The Cross of Christ

"But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." Galatians 6:14

As we near the end of the book of Galatians, it is important to review the main point of the book itself.

The first two chapters taught us that the Apostle Paul had a revelation of Christ and who He was. That revelation, that came by the Spirit of God, was that Christ accomplished the work of making us acceptable - we cannot do it ourselves!

Chapters 3-4 of the book of Galatians then establishes that one of the fundamental doctrines of the Christian faith is simply this - we are justified by faith before God and not by our works.

We cannot make ourselves worthy, and neither can we become good enough to be accepted before a holy God. We must accept and embrace the fact that Jesus Christ was the perfect substitute for our sin and our acceptance!

When we come to chapters 5 -6 there is a practical side of how we are to live in relation to this faith in what Christ has already accomplished.

- We stand fast in the liberty Christ has given;
- This liberty gives us confidence to love one another in His strength;
- Walking in the Spirit is not mystical, but practical, producing good fruit rather than the works of the flesh.
- We can now bear one another's burdens as well as expect those wounded to accept their responsibility!

The theme of the book is the cross. The cross of Christ cancels our debt of sin and makes us acceptable to God. It also becomes the principle of denying self so that we are no longer attracted to the things of the world.

The Scripture above has a declaration that we will not boast of our own strength but of what Christ did on the cross! It then yields two applications:

1st - the world is crucified unto me - in other words, it no longer holds the attraction it once did - it is personal growth, separation from sin, and holiness unto God.

2nd - *I* am crucified unto the world - in other words, I have no fear of entering into the world to serve, be salt and light, and allow the light of Christ to shine!

Sharing the Gospel Crucified unto the World

"But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified unto me, and I to the world.." Galatians 6:14

The closer we walk with Jesus, the purer we become and more separate we are from worldliness. Thus, the world is crucified to us, or in other words, holiness is not yielding to temptation.

However, that is only half the story. The work of the cross is two-fold, not just *separate* from the world, but now given to the world.

The cry of the believer has to be two-fold; save me from the evil of this age and keep me pure, but also show me where you are opening up avenues where I can serve and influence others within my culture.

As we allow our character to build a platform within the culture, we are then able to share the gospel that is accompanied by good works so that others may glorify God.

Let us pray that we can see the opportunities God opens before us to share the gospel as a result of being crucified to the world!

Highlights for Intercession

- Lord, help us to walk closer to you that we might be separate from the evil that surrounds us!
- Lord, help us to give ourselves to our culture by walking uprightly and sharing when you open up the doors of opportunity!





I remember September 8, 1980 when 28 students in grades K-5 lined up by the old church entrance ready to learn! It was our first year of school here at The New Testament Church.

We added a grade a year until we covered K-12 with our first graduating class in 1988 of three students, one of which still attends our church and the other two occasionally visit. That first class gift of a flag pole still stands! In fact, they said:

As the first graduating class, we hereby give this flag pole to The New Testament Christian School and succeeding classes of students to commemorate the two dominant themes for which our school stands. First, to always glorify God and Jesus Christ, who birthed America. Second, to remember to pray that the United States of America remain as "one nation under God."

We have now had 134 graduates, but hundreds of students who have attended at least a year throughout our 39 years of education!


Our Mission

Letters to the Churches by Dr. Ronald Bernier

I have known Dr. Ron Bernier of Masterbuilder Ministries for more than three decades. He is both a scholar and a teacher. When you read his latest book, you will agree.

Located in Fall River, Massachusetts, known for its stand for the gospel as well as economic trade, its name was derived from the "falling river" which the Natives called Quequechan. For more than a century (1811-1911) its mills drew thousands of immigrants from all over the world who cherished religious and civil freedom.

In this book, you will see that Dr. Bernier does not view the history of his town in isolation from the Church that he serves. He sees them connected, for that is why God places both people and Churches providentially in the part of the world He intends to influence with His Kingdom principles.

It is also why each church is referenced in the book of Revelation in relation to its location; i.e. to the church of Ephesus, etc. Jesus taught us to pray "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." As each church is referenced, the history of the city in which it dwells is connected to the spiritual truth that is conveyed to make them more influential.

This book is a refreshing look at the seven churches addressed in the book of Revelation, chapters 2-3. As Revelation 1:1 declares, the theme of the book is "the revelation of Jesus Christ." Too often the book of Revelation has been treated only as a book of the future or end-times and this can cloud its application for churches today.

Ron does a tremendous job highlighting how the attributes and "unveiling" of Jesus Christ can be seen through each individual letter addressed to the individual churches of the first century.

Ron's applications for today are priceless, and his conclusion wraps up with a great summary of the teachings contained in the New Testament. I highly recommend this book, and pray it re-ignites your vision for your city!
