God created Individuals, not Groups

- God did not create man by the numbers, in the multitudes. He could have spoken and brought forth thousands, millions, of human beings... as numerous as the fish of the sea, as plentiful as the birds in the sky, as many as the beasts of the earth. But, he didn't.
- He created one man (Adam), and from that one man, one woman (Eve). He made them two who became one (Gen. 2:24) to be fruitful and multiply. Through them He extended the gift of human life; through them He populated the earth with mankind, one by one.
- There are no group rights for by definition they are privileges

God created Man a Free Moral Agent

- God did not create robots, He created man. And, it was and is His will that man express his individuality.
 - Each individual is created in the image of God
 - Each individual has a full and independent value placed directly upon them by their Creator.
- No two persons are exactly alike; not even identical twins
 - God placed within mankind (men and women) infinite variation
 - "When God created Adam, He endowed him with the potential for all characteristics of all races and all individuals."

What causes Progress?

- The key to progress is the innovation of unique creativity
 - From spirituality to economics, God's variety can meet every need
 - "Human capacity for independent thought and action, when coupled with variation throughout the universe, is what gives rise to progress. And there is progress only to the extent that this capacity is allowed under liberty." F. A. Harper, 1965
- What is the opposite of individuality? Same-ness, uniformity
 - Uniformity produces a stagnant, static, oppressive society...
 - Individuals become digits, units, lives of quiet desperation...

Uniformity without Individual Expression

- Lucifer (Satan) is a Dictator
 - According to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience... fulfilling the desire of the flesh and of the mind... by nature children of wrath. Ephesians 2:2-3
 - the devil said to Him (Jesus), 'All this authority I will give you, and their glory... if you will worship before me... - Luke 4:5-7
- "Get behind me, Satan!" v. 8

- The world of Social Insects
 - ...the ways of the social insect world have been the envy 'of dictators... both large and small, (who) would like to ascend to the throne of the 'queen bee'... in which every human would become subservient to the dictator's own wishes.
- God did not create man to be an insect; He created man a living soul, a free moral agent, with an innate sense of moral values...

The Insect world of Instinct and Uniformity

These insect colonies are highly materialistic. Moral and spiritual considerations play no part. They are coldly harsh in their purpose and performance. They are 'inhuman' and wholly lack anything like the warmth of human love and compassion. Population is rigidly controlled. By killing those that do not work and by ruthlessly destroying the ill and the aged, full employment and 'high' production is maintained... a high 'national income' is maintained by imposing compulsion of labor at an early age, by compulsion of long work weeks and by prohibiting vacation with or without pay...

The Political Systems that enforce Uniformity

- Rushdoony (due to the fall) man's urge to dominion is now a perverted one, no longer an exercise of power under God and to His glory, but a desire to be God... History therefore has seen the long and bitter consequences of men's perverted urge to dominion... history is a long tale of horror in which man has sought power and dominion as an end in itself...
- Socialism State control of labor and its value
- Marxism State control of employers, pricing and income
- Communism State control of land and possessions
- Fascism State 'partnering' with select private business

The Dominion Charter empowered Individuality

- God gave men and women the mandate to steward the earth
 - This is to be carried out primarily by individuals using their gifts
 - Individuals then inspire others to work in teams for productivity
- Lord Action once said "power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely"
 - This is the sin of commission an act of aggression against God
- Edmund Burke once said "all that is necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing."
 - This is the sin of omission an act of passivity in the face of evil


In application of God's Individuality....

- <u>Internally</u>.... As a direct application of God's Sovereignty in the heart of the individual, one's faith will produce individual and unique works for *faith without works is dead*...
- Externally...
 - The civil government that is based on the principle of individuality recognizes the importance and dignity of the individual.
 - The civil government that denies or violates the principle of Individuality refuses the fact that we are made in God's image.
 - As Christians, we are to work for, construct and support, that form of civil government that is based on God's laws and principles.

America Formed on Biblical Individuality





Required Vaccines – a Covid-19 preview?

- Five States have removed medical and/or religious exemptions
 - Mississippi, West Virginia, Maine, New York, California
 - Will Massachusetts be the sixth State? (S.2763 and H.4784)
- Argument: if one individual refuses to get vaccinated, it will endanger the community; thus – we must require it for all
 - Vaccines are not 100% successful; there are dangerous side-effects
 - The Individual must be empowered with choice and responsibilities
- Biblical Principle of Individuality *Liberty of Conscience*
 - It is "liberty under law" not anarchy (individualism); which law?
 - Empowering the individual is what protects the community

So how do we begin to practice Individuality?


- Cultivate an individual walk with God in your prayer closet
