Lessons from the Shepherds in the birth of the Messiah




Now there were in the same country <u>shepherds</u> living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night



Who were the Shepherds in Jesus' Day?

Bottom rung – like tax-collectors; dung sweepers; rejected by culture Sheep and goats; death to crops? Rabbis banned pasturing sheep! But... Abel, Moses, David, Amos, weren't they shepherds? Shepherds were humble servants and had integrity of character





Who are Angels?

Spirits (mind, will, emotion), but no body (like demonic spirits) Messengers to aid believers Communicate with and appear to people; relating to God's people War in the heavenlies with demons **D**well in the atmosphere, but are not to be worshipped

And behold an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. Luke 2:9

Seraphim, Cherubim; archangels such as *Michael, Gabriel?*



Genealogies of Christ – God and Man

Servants don't need a genealogy (Mark); God can't have one (John)

Matthew's – Son of God

Joseph's descent from Abraham

- Lists 42 generations created, called, captive, then delivered
 - **Christ the** <u>66th</u> name listed

 Fulfillment of God's prophecy of Messiah of the Royal Line with Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba... Luke's – Son of Man

- Mary's line of ascent to God
- Lists 77 names from God to Christ, the God-man Messiah
 - **Christ the** <u>77th</u> name listed

 Fulfillment of God's prophecy of Messiah from the line of humble deliverers grafted into the royal line

Shepherds were close to God's heart

- Isaiah 57:15 I dwell... with him who has a contrite (lowly) and humble spirit
- Psalm 34:18 The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart
- The Kingdom of God operates bottom-up and inside-out from the heart
- Shepherds were humble, hungering for Messiah

The Angels announced the Incarnation

Then the angel said unto them, 'Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a <u>Savior</u>, who is Christ the Lord - Luke 2:10-11

The "city of David" was known as Bethlehem



Bethlehem – the "city of David"

Migdal Eder



Micah 4:8-10 – And you, O tower of the flock... to you shall it come... be in pain, and labor to bring forth... (shepherds one mile from Jerusalem keep watch over and prepare lambs) Micah 5:2 – But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be the Ruler in Israel...

Micah prophesies 700 years before the Messiah
The King would come from the "watchtower"
Migdal Eder was where the lambs were set aside

John 1:18 – *only begotten* – <u>monogenesis</u> – become flesh Titus 3:5 – *regeneration* – twice born – physical / spiritual




Swaddling clothes were given to the shepherds by the Priests for the birthing of the lambs <u>FULLY MAN</u>

And this will be a sign to you; You will find a Babe wrapped in <u>swaddling</u> clothes, lying in a <u>manger</u> Luke 2:12



The Gospel finds fertile soil in the humble heart And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men! (peace among men with whom He is pleased) Luke 2:13-14

And they came with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger. - Luke 2:16



Grateful shepherds make great <u>evangelists</u>.. this is what probably alerted Simeon and Anna in the Temple at Jerusalem

Now when they had seen Him, they made widely known the saying which was told them concerning this Child. And all those who heard it marveled at those things which were told them by the shepherds. Luke 2:17-18

Simeon and Anna confirm the divine destiny of Jesus at his birth

Luke 2:21-38

And now the hush of wondering expectancy fell once more on all, who heard what was told by the shepherds - this time not only in the hill-country of Judæa, but within the wider circle that embraced Bethlehem and the Holy City. And yet it seemed all so sudden, so strange. That such slender thread, as the feeble throb of an Infant-life, the salvation of the world should hang - and no special care watch over its safety, no better shelter be provided it than a 'stable,' no other cradle than a manger!

And still it is ever so. On what slender thread has the continued life of the Church often seemed to hang; on what feeble throbbing that of every child of God - with no visible outward means to ward off danger, no home of comfort, no rest of ease. But, 'Lo, children are Jehovah's heritage!' - and: 'So giveth He to His beloved in his sleep?
