Introduction:

1John 1:6-7 If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

Only in true fellowship with God is real fellowship with one another possible. Fellowship only exists when all parties are walking in the light of Christ together. Leave God out and we have a friendship that is earthbound. With God, all are dwelling as a family in God.
