

Jesus and Government

Those who are considered rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you shall be your servant.

Mark 10:42-43

The Origin of Tyranny is **Sin**

Satan played upon the heart of Eve and Adam

- Genesis 3:1 Has God indeed said you shall not eat of every tree of the garden? Eve responds in bitterness Sin originates and enhances evil.
- Genesis 3:4 You will not surely die. We are prone to deny consequences (responsibility).
- Genesis 3:5 you will be like God, knowing good and evil. Define right/wrong and control outcomes.

Consequence of Tyranny: Control

- Blame game Ge. 3:13 Adam/Eve; serpent
- Pain and suffering Ge. 3:16-18 multiply your sorrow... pain... toil (not wanting to work)
- Tyranny Ge. 3:16 ...he shall rule over you...

 God gave men and women responsibility to steward the earth and its resources, but not to manipulate and control each other!

The Definition of Tyranny

Biblical – The unjust control of another through the means of manipulation or force

Tyranny from Webster's 1828 - Arbitrary or despotic exercise of power; the exercise of power over subjects and others with a rigor not authorized by law or justice, or not requisite for the purposes of government.

Hence tyranny is often synonymous with cruelty and oppression.

Coronation of King George III (1739-1793)

- September 22, 1761
- 6-hour ceremony cost 8 million+
- Crowded streets, crowns, regalia
- 42 singers, 105 musicians
- Coronation Day, feasts, fireworks





Royalty had become more important than substance, yet John Hancock wrote he wanted to stay for it would be "the grandest thing I shall ever meet with."

John Hancock (1737-1793)





- 1754 graduated from Harvard
- 1760 visits London, is there when George II dies, and George III has his coronation ceremony...
- 1764 (27); is wealthiest in Boston after the death of his Uncle Thomas
- He moved into the mansion on top of Beacon Hill – House of Hancock

Harlow Unger in John Hancock: Merchant King and American Patriot...

Hancock loved his wealth. He reveled in it. He adored all the foppish trappings it could buy: the fashionable wigs, frilled shirts, silk and velvet jackets and breeches - and the shoes with silver or gold buckles that sparkled as he strode along Boston's Hancock Wharf... He owned Beacon Hill. His land covered its crest, and his was the only house there.






What changed John Hancock?

- Sugar Act of 1764... stood for liberty at great cost
- Lost ships Lydia and Liberty Writs of Assistance
- The trial of 1770 Boston Massacre one of principle
- Selectman of the town of Boston and a Legislator
- Signed the Declaration as a "death warrant" in 1776 serving as the President of the Continental Congress
- The change was the resurgence of Hancock's faith, under the leadership of his pastor, Samuel Cooper!


Samuel Cooper of Brattles Church



- Pastored John Hancock, Sam Adams, John Adams, James Bowdoin and Dr. Joseph Warren
- Highly influenced *Benjamin Franklin* and *Phyllis Wheatley*
- Helped establish the French alliance
- Preached the sermon that was published with the proposed Massachusetts Constitution of 1780...

SERMON Preached before his Excellency JOHN HANCOCK, Esq; Governor The Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts October 25, 1780 Being the date of the Commencement of the Constitution and Inauguration of the Government By Samuel Cooper, D.D.






Cooper's 1780 Sermon

- The characteristics of <u>tyranny</u> throughout history and recorded in the Old Testament
- The contrasting government of Israel before she chose a King a "republic" of the people
- How the Massachusetts constitution has been established on the <u>independence</u> of America and the nature of ancient Israel's republic

Samuel Cooper shepherds John Hancock

- Cooper corresponded with Thomas Pownell – former Governor of MA in 1757, who recalled Gov. Shirley...
- "most constitutional... Governor who ever represented the crown..." JAdam
- Cooper was able to preach the gospel without political divisiveness...
- Hancock and Cooper corresponded during the 1770's on defense of liberty

John Hancock's Call for a Day of Fasting and Prayer

Concord April 15, 1775

In circumstances as Dark as these... All confidence must be withheld from the Means we use; and reposed only on that GOD who rules in the Armies of Heaven, and without whose Blessing the best human Counsels are but Foolishness – and all created Power Vanity. It is the Happiness of His Church that, when the Powers of Earth and Hell combine against it... that the Throne of Grace is of the easiest access and its Appeal thither is graciously invited by the Father of Mercies, who has assured it, that when his Children ask Bread he will not give them a Stone...

The Declaration is a defining Document of Resistance to Tyranny

- Cl 1-10 Obstruction of justice oppression of people
- Cl 11-15 Military use of Civil law political bullying
- Cl 16-22 <u>Abuse of power</u> unlawful control beyond one's authority (jurisdiction)
- Cl 23-27 Using violence/chaos to gain control...
- Cl 28-31 Promotion of corruption evil is now good

(1) The Bible exposes Tyranny as an <u>obstruction of justice</u>

- Proverbs 10:12b The tender mercies (compassion) of the wicked are cruel.
- Isaiah 1:17 Learn to do good, seek justice, rebuke the oppressor; defend the fatherless, plead for the widow.

Oppressing people rather than defending a victim

(1) Obstruction of Justice

- William Blackstone 1753 to bereave a man of life, or by violence to confiscate his estate, without accusation or trial, would be so gross and notorious an act of despotism, as must at once convey the alarm of tyranny throughout the whole kingdom...
- Clause 8 "He has obstructed the Administration of Justice by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary Powers..."

(2) The Bible exposes Tyranny as forceful political bullying

- 1st Timothy 2:1-2 I exhort... that prayers... for all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.
- Matthew 22:39 ...you shall love your neighbor as yourself.

No Forceful / Military bullying of Civil Power

(2) Intrusion of Military in Civil Affairs

- James Madison 1795 Of all the enemies to public liberty, war is, perhaps, the most to be dreaded, for it comprises and develops the germ of every other... no nation could preserve its freedom in the midst of continual warfare.
- Clause 12 He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil Power.

(3) The Bible exposes Tyranny as an <u>abuse of power</u>

- Psalms 94:20 Shall the throne of iniquity, which devises evil by law, have fellowship with you?
- Proverbs 29:2 When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice, but when a wicked man rules, the people groan.

Unlawful control beyond one's Jurisdiction

(3) Abuse of Power

- John Locke 1690 tyranny is "the exercise of power beyond right."
- Clause 17 imposing Taxes... without Consent
- Clause 18 for depriving us in many cases, of the benefit of Trial by Jury...
- Clause 22 for suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever

(4) The Bible exposes Tyranny as using chaos to gain control

- Genesis 4:7 If you do well, will you not be accepted? ... If you do not do well, sin lies at the door. And its desire is for you, but... rule over it.
- Proverbs 25:28 Whoever has no rule over his own spirit is like a city broken... without walls.

Encouraging violence/chaos to increase control

(4) Incitement of Violence

- Alexander Hamilton 1788 Are not popular assemblies frequently subject to the impulses of rage, resentment, jealousy, avarice... and violent propensities? ...governed by a few individuals?
- Clause 24 He has plundered our seas, ravaged our coasts, burnt our towns... destroyed lives of people
- Clause 27 He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us...

(5) The Bible exposes Tyranny as the *promotion of corruption*

- Isaiah 5:20 Woe to those who <u>call</u> evil good, and good evil; who put darkness for light...
- Isaiah 10:1-2 Woe to those who <u>decree</u> unrighteous decrees, who write misfortune, which they have prescribed to rob the needy of justice... that widows may be their prey...

Corruption of character leads to tyrannical control

(5) Promoting Corruption

- Baron de Montesquieu 1730 No tyranny is more cruel than that which is practiced in the shadow of the law and with the trappings of justice...
- Clause 28 In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury.

"A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the Ruler of a Free People."



Biblical Interposition


- The doctrine of the Lower Magistrate

 A lawfully instituted civil official is to interpose
 between the people and a tyrannical higher power
- 2nd Chr. 10:16-11:4 Rehoboam & Jeroboam
- 2nd Chr. 22-23; 2nd Kings 11 Queen Athaliah
- 2nd Chr. 26:16-23 Uzziah Church & State

The Declaration: a Document of Interposition



We, therefore, the representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled...




John Hancock – March 5, 1774

Some boast of being friends to government; I am a friend to righteous government, to a government founded upon the principles of reason and justice; but I glory in publicly avowing my eternal enmity to tyranny...

Break in sunder, with noble disdain, the bonds with which the Philistines have bound you... Suffer not yourselves to be betrayed, by the soft arts of luxury... Despise the glare of wealth... people who pay greater respect to a wealthy villain than to an honest, upright man in poverty, almost deserve to be enslaved...

I have the most animating confidence that the present noble struggle for liberty will terminate gloriously for America. ...let us humbly commit our righteous cause to the great Lord of the universe, who loveth righteousness and hateth iniquity. And having secured the approbation of our hearts, by a faithful and unwearied discharge of our duty to our country, let us joyfully leave our concerns in the hands of him who raiseth up and putteth down the empires and kingdoms of the world as he pleases; and with cheerful submission to his sovereign will devoutly say.


